No activity is obligatory. No one gets eliminated. Missing an activity just means zero points for that activity. No fancy horse required. No fancy clothing required. But hard hats to BRC's 2016 standard are obligatory. The competition is for individuals but you will ride in pairs.

Aim: To have fun with your horse testing and practising the skills you might need when out hacking

Format: Our Fun Trec will comprise three phases:

Mini-orienteering**
Control of paces
Obstacle course (10 elements)

** A short, timed hack over a measured distance, off-road and on local lanes, that requires very basic map reading skills and should ideally be ridden at rates notified in advance for walk, trot and canter. Hi-viz gilet or jacket and mobile phone advised.

Winner and placings will be awarded on the total individual points scored. Points will be adapted from the British Trec Rules and awarded for each obstacle + control of paces + orienteering.
