Details of height classes, entry fees for teams & individuals.

For all the classes:

- * First round of jumping will take place in outdoor arena.
- * Second round of jumping will take place in the indoor arena.

Senior Winter 80 Show Jumping Qualifier

Open to Teams of 4 members & individual riders.

Entry fee per rider: £25

Course height in first round: 80cms.

Senior Winter 90 Show Jumping Qualifier

Open to teams of 4 riders & individual riders.

Entry Fee per rider: £25

Course height in first round: 90cms

Senior Winter 100 Show jumping Qualifier

Open to teams of 4 riders & individual riders.

Entry fee per rider: £25.

Course height in first round: 100cms.

Senior Winter 110 Show Jumping Qualifier.

Open to teams & individual riders.

Entry fee per rider: £25.

Course height in first round: 110cms.

Rules for the Winter Show Jumping Qualifier on Saturday 2nd March

Running order on the day.

All first jumping rounds will take place in the outdoor arena followed circa 30 minutes later by second round in indoor arena.

This means the Novice class for everyone should be completed quite quickly.

In the event of large entries we will endeavour to put in another course walks half way through the class.

The order of jumping will be all 4 team members to jump one after another.

This helps with good team morale & easier for Team Managers & supporters.

Competition for teams of 4 to jump two rounds each. The best three scores in each round to count. It is also open to individual competitors.

If **one** competitor of a team of 4 is eliminated in the first round they are permitted to jump in the second round. If **two** competitors from a team of 4

(or **one** competitor from a team of 3) are eliminated in first round, then the team is eliminated and will not be permitted to jump in second round, however the remaining members can continue as individuals.

In the event of a tie for first place, the times from the second round will be used to place teams / individuals.

The order of clubs will drawn and advised to the Team manager.

Times will be on the TVRC website: www.tvrc.co.uk on Thursday 28th February and on HWRC website: www.hwrc.org.uk & on Area 6 facebook.

Original vaccination and / or passports must be submitted to the Secretary on the day on collection of numbers for each horse before taking part in the competition.

Passports will checked & must be collected before you go home.

Your horse must have up to date influenza vaccinations in line with rule G7 in the current 2019 BRC Handbook.

Lorry & trailer parking on the day

Please advise your Club members that due to main & nearest parking available there must be NO tie-up of horses on either side of lorries & trailers. Please park close to next vehicle, as the overflow parking will be further away from the arenas.(Near the Monument).

Please pick up all your horse's droppings from lorry park before leaving.

Every effort will be made to get competitors through quickly as the organisers anticipate a busy day, we would be obliged if competitors could leave promptly at the end of their class if they are not required for the prize giving.

Protective Headwear Rules.

Correct riding attire must be worn at all times. When mounted at any BRC event whether competing or not ' Protective Headwear ' must be worn & fastened under the chin is mandatory .

All hat must have the aqua hat tag visible with either BRC, PC or BE logos. Failure to do so will incur elimination.

All protective headwear can be checked at the Area 6 competitions and tagged before competing if you have not got the aqua tag.

Protective Headwear constitutes a hat which meets one of the following standards:

British: PAS 015: 1998 or 2011 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked.

VG1 01.040: 2014-12 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked.

European: VG1 01.040: 2014-12 provide they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked.

American: ASTM F1163: 2004a or 04a onwards provided they are SEI marked.

SNELL E2001 or SNELL E2016

Australian & New Zealand: AS/NZS 3838: 2006 onwards provided they are SAI global marked. For hat standards download Headgear at www.bhs.org.uk.
