Class 4: Senior Prelim Combined Training
Dressage Test: BRC HT 90 Q (2013)
SJ round fence height : 75 cms

Open to individual riders

Entry fee per rider : £30

Class 5 Senior Novice Combined Training.
Dressage Test: BRC HT 100 Q (2013)
SJ round fence heights: 85 cms

Open to individual riders.

Entry fee per rider: £30

Class 6 Senior Combined Training Team.
Two competitors will ride BRC HT 90Q (2013) / SJ 75cm
Two competitors will ride BRC HT 100Q (2013) / SJ 85 cm

Entry fees per Team: £120

** All OBHRC members who are interested in being part of a team or competing as individual in any of the above classes.

Rules for the Combined Training Qualifier on Sunday 17th March

All riders must be fully paid up members of the OBHRC and their membership needs to be registered with the BRC before the closing date of pre- entries. (By the 15th February 2019.)

Format: We can either enter teams of 4 riders or individuals at Prelim or Novice level.

For a Team 2 members will do the 90Q and 2 members the 100Q.

The Prelim test is BRC Horse Trials test 90Q (2013) and then jump a round of 75cm show jumps.

The Novice test is BRC Horse Trials test 100Q (2013) and then jump a round of 85cm show jumps.

Dressage and show jumping will both be outside with some competitors riding their dressage tests on grass arenas. Note: Rosehill has designated dressage arenas that have good old turf, not grazed or ridden on outside competitions & very flat.

One section of the dressage for the Prelim will be ridden on the grass and one on the surface and similarly for the Novice. For Teams please specify which riders can ride on the grass arenas. SJ rounds & all warm up will be on the surface.

One helper must be provided for each team entered.

Any change of horse or rider must be notified to the Secretary at least 15 minutes before the start of the class.

Times will be on www.chilterridingclub.co.uk on 14th March & on Area 6 facebook.

Eligibility: For the Prelim/75cm CT you must not have any BD points, BE or BS points. Horses may be currently registered with BE but must not have been placed in the top 6 at BE 90 or competed at BE 100, BRC HT/CH or above in the current or previous year at the close of the prelim entry on February 24th 2019.

For the Novice /85cm CT you may have up to 225 notional BS points and up to 10BE points & 35 Elementary points, no BD Medium points.

Cost: The entry fee will be £30 per horse for an individual & £30 per team member. ***(Old Berkeley Hunt Riding Club are willing to pay the extra BRC Pre-entry fee of £29 per team or £9.50 per individual to help OBHRC members to compete.)***

Directions to Rosehill.

There is a one way system that must be used & will be signed. From the the M4, M40 & A4 – follow the A404(M) & then the A4130 towards Henley, passing through the village Called Hurley. You will shortly pass a pub on your right The Black Boy. Continue past the turning to left to Rosehill & along the A4130 until a turning on the left is reached signposted Cockpole Green. Take this left turn & drive carefully down the lane which is narrow in places. Past upper Culham farm Rt side. Through Cockpole Green, at the fork in the road take the left side (Warren Row Lane).

Carry on to the crossroads, there turn left on to Rose Lane. You go past Dean Place Farm on left. Rosehill entrance will be signposted on left side.

From Henley follow the A4130 towards Maidenhead. At the top of the hill take the right turn towards Cockpole Green.

Flu Vaccinations

Original vaccination and / or passports must be submitted to the Secretary on the day on collection of numbers for each horse before taking part in the competition.

Passports will checked & must be collected before you go home.

Your horse must have up to date influenza vaccinations in line with rule G7 in the current 2019 BRC Handbook.

Protective Headwear Rules.

Correct riding attire must be worn at all times. When mounted at any BRC event whether competing or not ‘ Protective Headwear ‘ must be worn & fastened under the chin is mandatory .

All hat must have the aqua hat tag visable with either BRC, PC or BE logos. Failure to do so will incur elimination.

All protective headwear can be checked at the Area 6 competitions and tagged before competing if you have not got the aqua tag.

Protective Headwear constitutes a hat which meets one of the following standards:

British: PAS 015: 1998 or 2011 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked.

VG1 01.040: 2014-12 provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked.

European: VG1 01.040: 2014-12 provide they are BSI Kitemarked or Inspec IC marked.

American: ASTM F1163: 2004a or 04a onwards provided they are SEI marked. SNELL E2001 or SNELL E2016

Australian & New Zealand: AS/NZS 3838: 2006 onwards provided they are SAI global marked. For hat standards download Headgear at
